Our Curriculum Aims:

We aim to develop a lifelong love of the study of the French language and the global French speaking world and civilisations past, present and future amongst our students playing a pivotal role in their journey to becoming inquiring, knowledgeable, responsible citizens of the future with the confidence to travel, ready to work in a global workforce.

Students learn to communicate confidently in French whilst also listening, reading and viewing for personal enjoyment and information. This also develops a great cultural awareness of a whole new world, essential for accessing the subject to maximum. This digital age lends itself perfectly to our work and the French department always embraces the use of new technologies, learning platforms and the extensive resources available for multidisciplinary and multi-sensory learning in and outside of lessons. We ensure careful use of authentic resources at all levels in order to enrich the experience and promote independent learning. The interactive nature of lessons also serves to maximise engagement and develop the ability to understand and manipulate the language.

The study of French and the grammar involves a process which in turn also trains the brain and can keep it healthier for longer and strengthen other academic in new contexts disciplines. From the study of earlier and more personal topics to the challenges of social and global issues such as the protection of the planet, Cybersociety, immigration, politics, the treatment of criminals the protection of heritage and chosen research projects, the French department promotes and reinforces the AGSB values.

What can parents do to support their sons?

- Check that your son is working on his vocabulary this should be done on a regular basis, revisiting old vocabulary constantly too. He should always revise vocabulary, even when tests are not set. He can access all of the vocabulary needed via Quizlet/languagenut/Seneca (he has usernames and passwords). He also has an assessment booklet, in which he should highlight the vocabulary he knows from each module and continue to highlight it regularly. You could test him using this.
- Check he is working on his grammar this, again, should be done on a regular basis. Grammar notes are in his exercise book and available in many other places (he has the usernames and passwords for the numerous websites). He has a grammar review section in the coursebook and on Kerboodle.com so you can quiz him on the grammar topics too. Year 9 and above have a GCSE Verbs booklet.
- There are a number of other websites that your son should visit to help him. Please ask him about them.
- Any opportunity for your son to experience authentic French would be a real confidence booster for him, for example, visiting France, reading online news articles via the newshound app, watching French Youtube videos, Age appropriate Netflix programmes -with French subtitles and working with our Language Assistant.

You are already part way there!

Four skills are tested in a formal exam at the end of Year 11. Each skill is worth 25% of your total GCSE. You will be entered for either Foundation or Higher tier. The exams are set out below:

Listening:

You will answer questions on recorded material from different topic areas. Some material will be

formal (for example a telephone message) and some informal (for example a telephone conversation between friends).

Cultivating Greater

Reading:

You will answer questions about short texts on different topics in various forms such as text messages, adverts, emails, blogs and letters. You will also translate a paragraph from French into English.

Speaking:

This exam will be conducted by your teacher. You will have range of activities to complete. You will take part in a role play with your teacher, you will answer questions about a photo and the related sub-topic and then have a general conversation on a topic you have previously studied.

Writing:

There are three main tasks to complete. First you will write a short response to bullet points on a certain topic. You will then show off all of your language skills in a more detailed response to bullet points and finally you will translate a short passage from English into French.

What can I do after I have completed the course?

People with language skills and knowledge are highly thought of in the modern world. They stand out as talented, confident and successful people, with broad and exciting horizons. Being able to speak more than one language has been scientifically proven to give people higher cognitive ability. Taking GCSE language(s) means you will have much more fun when travelling and be able to continue your language learning to A Level. You will add an extra dimension to your personal skills profile which will impress anyone who reads your CV and you will be in a stronger position to get a job in companies with international links or to work abroad. You will also be able to choose between many careers that you may not have previously thought of such as working as a calls interceptor for MI5, being responsible for international links in global companies or even opening new franchises in foreign countries. The options are endless!

Recommended Revision Guides for GCSE

If possible the supplementary resources such as translation practice, grammar workbooks, translation workbooks, flashcard for vocabulary and grammar / Translation and the knowledge organiser bundle. ** We will issue a letter to parents in Year 10 providing the opportunity to offer these at heavily discounted prices only available to schools.

Students have access to various websites to help with their vocabulary, reading, listening and grammar revision. All pupils have a list of useful websites and they should refer to this.

Kerboodle allows students to access the core GCSE textbook and interactive activities.

Support available for GCSE Students

For Year 11 students there are extra listening, and speaking sessions every week to enable the students to practise the skills that they need more help with. Subject teachers may also offer one-to-one sessions for GCSE students to have very focused practice with feedback
