Dear Parents, Carers and Students

This week it has been great to welcome staff and students from Colegi Sagrada School in Barcelona as part of our Spanish Exchange experience. Our visitors have been staying with their AGSB host families and have taken on cultural trips to Manchester, Liverpool and Chester. Last week, the Government declared their intention to award a £15m contract to tackle the systemic decline in the number of pupils in England taking foreign languages at GCSE and A-level. At AGSB, we are preparing our students for work in a global society and are currently one of the few state funded schools who offer a choice of five languages.

Last week, best-selling author Martin Griffin from the VESPA Academy delivered inspirational presentations to Y11, Y13 and Parents and Carers. He focused on attitudes to learning, tried and tested revision strategies and how to establish and sustain positive learning mind-sets at Key Stage 4 and 5. I hope that the students will 'latch on' to many of these strategies as we approach the exam season.

It has been a busy fortnight for the Music Department. Last week we enjoyed an exceptional Spring Concert and it was a delight to observe such a wide range of age groups performing so well. This week, AGSB Choirs and Bands are performing at the Music for Youth event in Birmingham and on Tuesday we held our inaugural Battle of the Bands event which was followed by the House Talent show. All students who performed on Tuesday afternoon did themselves proud.

In Design & Technology, many congratulations to Daniel, Harris, Manthan and Emmanuel from Y11 who have negotiated the initial stages of the prestigious Arkwright Scholarship via a rigorous Aptitude Test and Personal Statement process. I wish them the best of luck when they are called for interview.

On the pastoral front, I am delighted to report that we currently have 23 trained Y12 Peer Mentors working with a number of our younger pupils. Navigating life through the teenage years is a complex process and recent research has shown that Peer Mentoring is a highly effective intervention for mental health support in schools. Indeed, a recent study by the University of Sussex found that Peer Mentors had a positive impact on the mental health of both the mentors and the mentees, with benefits including improved self-esteem, increased empathy, and reduced anxiety levels.

In sport, we are enjoying continued success in rugby 7's, football, tennis and hockey. Congratulations to the 1st VII Rugby team who won the County Shield. Football teams across all age groups are making good progress in the GM and Trafford Cups. In hockey, the Under 16's and 1st XI are still going strong in the National competitions and well done to the 1st tennis squad of Mike, Nic, Dan and Charlie who represented the school at the Y11-13 tennis Regional Finals in Sunderland on Thursday. They performed amazingly well and came 3rd in the North of England.

I wish the best of fortune to Y10 as they embark on their internal exams next week. I also wish the best of luck to the students who are travelling to London to represent the School in the IEA Budget Challenge Finals in Westminster and the Geology Schools Challenge final which take place at the Royal Geological Society.

Model United Nations

Model United Nations, commonly known as MUN, is a simulation of the United Nations where students act as delegates from different countries to debate, discuss, and resolve global issues. MUN aims to provide students with an opportunity to learn about international relations, diplomacy, and the workings of the United Nations.



Participants research their assigned country's foreign policies, prepare speeches, negotiate with other delegates, and collaborate to draft resolutions that address real-world problems.

Engaging in MUN has numerous benefits. Firstly, it develops crucial skills such as public speaking, negotiation, and critical thinking, which are highly valued in academic and professional settings. Secondly, it provides a platform for participants to learn about global issues and international relations, fostering greater awareness and understanding of the world around us. Additionally, MUN encourages teamwork and collaboration as participants must work together to draft resolutions and negotiate with other countries to reach a consensus. Finally, it offers opportunities for participants to expand their social networks, make new friends, and develop their leadership abilities.



At MUN (Model United Nations) we run an in-school session every Tuesdays in E7 for Years 10 to 13 to practice and teach MUN as well as decide who we will select for our delegations. We are planning to introduce another session for Years 7 to 9. Throughout the academic year we participate in 5 interschool Conferences where we take a number of our best delegates to compete and carry out what we practice on a Tuesday session. Whilst it may seem like a big step up from the in-school sessions it's a brilliant opportunity to not only practice your MUN skills but also to represent the School and make new friendships with people you may never have met outside of MUN. The new leadership team wants to continue the enormous success of the previous year at external Conferences, but we also want to overhaul how MUN runs in school and create more opportunities inside the School as

well as for younger years which previously never had the chance to take part in MUN. We plan to run the first ever Conference here at AGSB which will provide a variety of new opportunities for a range of people with different skillsets not just traditional MUN or debating.

Y13 Geology Field Trip to Cyprus



Last week Mr Parker, Mr Giffen and Doc Rock (Dr Stephen) took the Year 13 Geologists on the annual field trip to Cyprus. It was great to reinstate this iconic trip after a hiatus due to Covid. It had been 20 years since Mr Parker first visited Cyprus with Doc Rock and it seemed fitting for the Doc to show him round again giving a new teacher's perspective.

Cyprus has a unique geological history and the students explored its beaches making indepth sedimentological, metamorphic and structural observations. We headed to the north of the island, close to the Turkish border to make conclusions about the vast mineral wealth that Cyprus once has, this even



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included a trip to an old gold mine, sadly for the boys no new deposits were found. We also ventured high up into the Troodos Mountains to examine the ophiolite sequence, which was formed deep on the ocean floor, travelling higher we even managed to enter mantle rocks, a rare experience for any geologist.

We were treated to beautiful fieldwork conditions, bright sunshine, 20 degree heat and a lovely coastal breeze, although we did get a taste of home with some snow up in the mountains.
