Dear Parents and Carers

There is a clear academic focus across a number of year groups this term. Years 10 and 12 are working hard to prepare for their trial exams which take place over the next few weeks. Meanwhile, Year 11 and Year 13 need to keep a laser focus on maximising their learning from the trial examinations as they look forward to the public exams which begin in May.

Last week, the Department for Education launched a campaign to improve attendance across all schools in the UK. The campaign strapline is "moments matter, attendance counts". Although attendance at AGSB is above the national average, can I remind Parents and Carers not to organise holidays and visits abroad during term time. All students should be aiming for 97% - 100% attendance (unless they have experienced periods of illness) across each term.

Last week, former Royal Marine, David Coleman, delivered an inspirational talk to members of the 6th Form as part of the ACE programme. David talked about the many challenges he has had to overcome in life, from school to Marines training and from Afghanistan to life after the military. David talked passionately about mental health and the importance for boys/men to open up and talk about whatever difficulties they are experiencing.

AGSB students have been involved in two major charitable initiatives this week. On Monday and Tuesday, 100's of students flocked to the Coleman Hall for the annual AGSB Islamic Society (ISOC) Food Sale. This year, funds are being raised for the humanitarian crisis in Sudan. Many thanks to ISOC and all the parents and family members who work tirelessly to provide the food and drink. Over the past seven years, this event has raised over £34,000 for various humanitarian charities.

AGSB, once again, supported the Altrincham vs Cancer fundraiser. Members of MedSoc raised a grand total of £1,957.21 for the OddBalls Foundation, the UK's leading charity, spreading awareness about Testicular Cancer and supporting those affected by it.

Many thanks to all Parents and Carers who joined us for the PFA Curry and Quiz night. The food was excellent, and I am delighted to report that the quiz was won by the staff team!

There has been a good deal of sporting success across all sports over the past fortnight, however, the two teams of the month (so far) are the Under 16 Badminton Squad who are through to the National Finals after defeating Bedford School, and the Under 16 Basketball team who were crowned Trafford Champions.

As I write, we are greatly looking forward to the second major musical event of 2024 – The Spring Concert.


