

We began by investigating the contrast between different parts of Manchester. It's not a City of terraces and owners anymore, but a lot of the old patterns remain true. Being surrounded by derelict, unwelcoming depots just minutes after visiting the high-rise, furnished haven of the City Centre really made me question whether we were in the same Manchester. It was also unimaginable to think that just 10 years earlier, Spinningfields's boutique park full of trendy stores was merely wasted brownfield land.

Day two was about exploring Ancoats, one of the most attractive neighbourhoods in the UK. They managed to prop up modern and vibrant housing right alongside the old Victorian builds, and somehow (mostly) pulled it off. Taimor and I were then heavily challenged in trying to survey locals and their opinions. No one seemed to have a few minutes to spare!

These Manchester expeditions opened my eyes to the City we live in, and how places change. The types of land-use, buildings and people can all be learnt on paper, but to see how the world works, you really do need to see the world. Thank you to Mr Bromley and the Geography Department.

### **Raising Awareness for Charity**




It was a pleasure to welcome back Tony Collier and Alex McCann to support Tony in completing his daily 5km run to raise funding and awareness for MOVE Charity.
