Dear Parents, Carers and Students

A very warm welcome back, especially to families who have recently joined AGSB.

I hope you all had an enjoyable and relaxing summer. It has been wonderful to see the School in action again with the return of our students and colleagues. Students returned to school last Thursday in glorious sunshine, which now seems a somewhat distant memory as the rain cascades against my office window! New routines are becoming established quickly as students and teachers set targets for the year ahead. Sports fixtures have begun and rehearsals for West Side Story are gaining pace as we look forward to the whole school drama production later this term.

We have started the year on a high, with excellent results at A level and GCSE. At A level, a record (prepandemic) 85% of grades were at A*- B and we now know that the majority of last year's Year 13 have won places at their chosen destinations, ranging from Oxbridge to degree apprenticeships with multinational corporate organisations.

GCSE headlines were also impressive, with 82% of entries graded 7-9. Last year Ofqual (the exam regulator) informed schools that grade boundaries would return to 2019 levels; so, although there has been a stark fall nationally in the number of top grades awarded at A level and GCSE, we can be extremely pleased to come out significantly higher than 2019.

This level of attainment speaks volumes for the progress made by the School during the years of the pandemic and its aftermath, as well as for the dedication of last year's exam cohorts and their teachers. We look forward to acknowledging this achievement at the GCSE and A level prize-giving later this term.

We have much to look forward to between now and Christmas across the range of school activities. Thanks in advance to all Parents and Carers for everything you do to support your son's endeavours in school.

The AGSB House event calendar kicks off next week with the House Cross Country and we are also looking forward greatly to one of the seminal House events – The House Shout, which takes place on the evening of the 31st October in the Coleman Hall (all Parents and Carers are welcome).

Last weekend sport made a welcome return with competitive rugby and football fixtures against Birkenhead School and King's Chester. Tomorrow, we look forward to rugby and football fixtures against AKS Lytham and Rossall School. It will be good to see Parents/Carers at fixtures and events again this term. Geography Fieldtrip – Eryri 2023

The Year 11 Geography GCSE students have recently returned from a productive and enjoyable field visit to Eryri. The students departed early on Thursday, 7th September to the Rhyd Y Creuau Field Studies Centre in order to spend the day collecting some valuable data for their Paper 3 examination at the end of the Year. The students thoroughly enjoyed their time in the Afon Conwy river, even if their socks did get a bit wet! The students were investigating how river characteristics changed downstream by measuring the width, depth and velocity of the river across three sites. They were certainly hungry by the time they returned to the Centre and, to the delight of the chefs, cleared them out of all the pasta and cake!

The next day the students visited Cwm Idwal to look at evidence of past glaciation which was a great opportunity for them to consolidate what they had learned in Year 10. They were even treated to a fly past by some RAF jets on manoeuvres which was very impressive.

Overall, the students worked really hard and had an enjoyable time.

Here is some information written by his family about why we have run amazing events and challenges for the last 15 years. We have also raised £50,000 for other charities in Chad's name.

"Chadwick Mulholland was born on 3rd September 1990. He was a quiet, caring, loving and very intelligent boy.

In January 2005 at the age of 14, he discovered a lump on his neck, it was then that our lives changed drastically and in the three and-a-half years that followed, Chad suffered relapse after relapse, but never lost his enthusiasm for life.

In May 2007 he not only had a bone marrow transplant, which we thought was the answer to our prayers, but somehow finding the strength from (I don't know where) managed not only to take his GCSE's, albeit in isolation in hospital and at home, but gained 10 A*'s. Then after the Hodgkins Lymphoma came back for the fourth time in September 2007, he still found the strength to sit an A Level in Further Maths obtaining an A the week before he died on 18th August 2008.

He was our star and now our angel, he is much loved and will always be remembered by all his family and friends.

In September 2008 with the help of his old school, Altrincham Grammar School for Boys, we set up Chad's Challenges, for anyone wanting to set a personal challenge for themselves, whilst having fun and raising much needed funds for The Young Oncology Unit at The Christie (now the Palatine Treatment Centre) who do a fantastic job in making the worst of situations into a comfortable one".

Here's to a great final Chad's Challenge.
