Many thanks to Mr Gallamore (Head of Careers), Dr Thomas (Assistant Head) and all the exhibitors who attended.










### Book Fest 2024




### **Well Done**


### **Under 14 Greater Manchester Plate Winners!**


Another date for your diary!
