Dear Parents, Carers and Students

It was marvellous to see so many Year 7 and Year 8 parents at the Parents' & Friends' Association Welcome Evening last Tuesday and Wednesday. The work of the AGSB PFA has been superb in the last year, despite the Pandemic, and I would encourage all parents to keep an eye on events and, if they have the time to do so, to get involved. Their sons, of course, are soon to return from their Bushcraft residential. The trip has been a great success and almost all of Year 7 and Year 8 were able to participate. Many thanks to staff for enabling this important bonding event to go ahead. We are very pleased to see our trips and visits programme opening up again - it is one of our key provisions and offers superb opportunities for our boys.

As you are aware, the School has been following Outbreak Management and Contingency Measures this week. Face Coverings are now mandatory (for those not exempt) in all communal areas and the NHS Mobile Testing Unit have been providing PCR tests for pupils in Years 9-13. We are hoping that these additional measures will help us to reduce the increase in cases so that we can revert back to our normal operating procedures as soon as possible.

This term we have introduced Pastoral Support sessions for all year groups which will take place at a specified time during the lunch break each week. These sessions are run by the Heads of Year and are used for pastoral mentoring or support in academic work/organisation. If your son is interested in attending a session, they should contact their Head of Year.

In sport, we have been in cup action with the 1st XV making it through the opening round of the Nat West and Cheshire Cups with good wins against Stockport GS and The Grange. There have also been some excellent performances from the younger age groups. In football the Under 12's, 15's 16's and 1st XI are making good progress in the Greater Manchester Cup, unfortunately the 1st XI were knocked out of the National Cup on Wednesday narrowly losing 3-4 to Lymm High School.

I wish the very best of fortune to the AGSB Model United Nations team who travel to Cheadle Hulme School (CHS) during the weekend to take part in the 2021 MUNCH. This year is the 21st anniversary of the MUN at CHS which attracts some of the top MUN teams from across the country.

Tomorrow we have football and rugby fixtures against Bury Grammar School and Stockport Grammar School and I wish all those participating the best of luck.

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Shine School Media Awards




Congratulations to the AGSB Publication Team who have once again been recognised at the Shine Media Awards. The School Magazine 'The Word' was highly commended for best overall content.

Bullying Survey



Following an earlier Parental Survey in the summer term, we decided to follow up the results by looking at the issue of bullying in school. It asked questions like:

- Has your child been bullied at school?
- Was the bullying dealt with quickly and effectively?
- If not, then to elaborate on where their dissatisfaction came from

We received 400 responses, 21 of which said that their son was bullied and just 3 expressed dissatisfaction with how the matter was dealt with. While the overall result was pleasing, we cannot be entirely satisfied until there is no bullying within school, and all our students feel safe, secure and happy in the School environment.

The key to moving closer to our goal is for parents and students to inform the school immediately they feel that their son is being bullied, or for students themselves to trust the Pastoral Team to deal with their concerns in a sympathetic and sensitive manner. We take every report of bullying seriously and we would like to think that students would feel comfortable in reporting incidents of bullying to any responsible adult within the school. Not reporting such incidents for fear of being accused of 'snitching' is not living up to the school value of taking 'responsibility' seriously. All reports are treated in strict confidence.

Deputy Head Clinic

After half-term, I will be opening a Deputy Head's Clinic for those parents who have a major concern about their son's progress and who would value a face to face conversation with myself about their son. The Clinic will take place on a Week A Friday at Period 5 (2.25pm-3.20pm). If any parent feels that they would like the opportunity to speak to me, then please feel free to ring Reception and book an appointment.

The Sports Portal

If you want to see the full Sports Programme, with details of all AGSB's fixtures, results, match reports, results and more, then you can visit <u>http://socs.agsb.co.uk</u>.



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To see at a glance what's on, where and when, you have a number of choices:

- You can navigate to our Sports Calendar via the main menu, and then select the day you are interested in. This shows the venue and if we are playing away, there will be a link to the location map of our opponent's school. You can also see the team selected for the fixture wherever you see this blue image . Team selections are usually announced at least the day before and, in some cases, 48 hours before. From the Sports Calendar you can also click directly through to a team's fixtures & results listing by clicking the Team's Name. e.g. click on the "Boys U12A".
- If you are following a particular team or teams, you can also select **Sports & Teams Fixtures & Results** from the main menu. Then select a particular sport and your team to see **past results and upcoming fixtures**.
- From any team's Fixtures & Results listings you can also **download** the entire fixture list to your personal calendar on your PC or mobile device (such as an iPhone or iPad). Any changes we make to our fixtures will be synchronised with your personal calendar whenever you connect your PC or mobile device to the Internet. **NOTE**: If you have already logged in and synced your child's timetable to your personal calendar, then doing this may create a duplicate event!

If you are visiting our sports website on your mobile phone you will notice it loads up as a Mobile Web App. Full instructions for how to get the most out of the Web App can be found online by clicking <u>HERE</u>. The mobile Web App will allow you to access Fixture and Team Sheet information on the go!

Reminder - Lateral Flow Testing at Home

Up to one in three people who have COVID-19 can spread the virus without knowing. This is because they have no symptoms. We are therefore reminding all parents to encourage their children to test on Monday and Thursday in order to help us to keep AGSB open.

Please remind your son(s) to continue with Lateral Flow Device Testing twice weekly on a Monday and a Thursday morning.

To summarise:

- Please look at the instructions in the pack on how to perform testing
- Carry out testing every Monday and Thursday morning, preferably before breakfast is eaten
- Report the result to school and NHS via website
- If the result is positive please arrange for your child to have a <u>PCR test</u> and report this result to school using the <u>covid@agsb.co.uk</u> address.
