Dear Parents, Carers and Students

We have now reached the end of the exam season and whether your son has taken End of Year exams or GCSE and A level public exams, I do hope that all has gone well. The 'End of Year' exams are an excellent opportunity to see how well students are performing in their range of subjects and also to inform how improvements might be made. In many cases, this 'follow-up' is more important than the result itself. Can I take this opportunity to thank our Exams Officer, Mrs Howell, and her team for all their efforts over the past two months.

On Tuesday, we held a SEAL day (Social and Emotional Aspects of Learning) for Year 8. As it is Pride month, the day focused on celebrating the work of LGBTQ+ people, learning about LGBTQ+ history and some of the issues affecting the LGBTQ+ community. One of the ways the School looks to promote diversity and inclusion is by engaging in different celebratory months and weeks, such as Black History Month and Pride. 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English Literary Festival




Congratulations to Hugo S-F (12WK) (left) who has won highly commended in the French Flash Fiction Competition run by the University of Oxford.

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Y8 Geography Trip to Llandudno



On Friday 23rd June, myself, and 59 other Year 8 students went out to visit the seaside town of Llandudno. The purpose of the trip was to enhance our learning of the 'Crumbling Coasts' unit we learnt this year and to develop our geographical fieldwork skills. It was an incredible and highly

educational experience that taught various fieldwork skills including data collection and data logging in preparation for Year 9.

We arrived at school early as the journey would take a while in rush hour traffic! We got off the coach in Llandudno at around 9.30am and were split off into groups of 15. The first task we were given was to climb the Great Orme, a 207-metre headland (that was home to vibrant flowers and various vegetation) to investigate the limestone rock. We then climbed down the Great Orme to carry out tally charts on litter, pedestrian flow, and traffic count to answer our main key question, *"To what extent do the positive impacts of tourism in Llandudno outweigh the negatives?"* After this, around midday, we walked along the pier (the longest in Wales at 700 metres) where we found a spot to eat lunch. We were then given 15 minutes to look around the selection of shops for souvenirs and snacks. Afterwards we carried out a couple more pedestrian counts in various locations and then strolled along the Promenade and talked about the sea defences that were in place, which was very fascinating! The time ran away with us, and it was soon time to go, so we got onto our coach and set off, deep down not wanting to leave! An enjoyable day had by all.




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Y12 Geology Trip to the Vale of Eden, Cumbria
