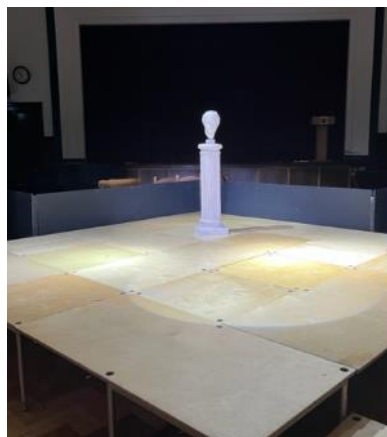
A Performance of 'Bacchae'

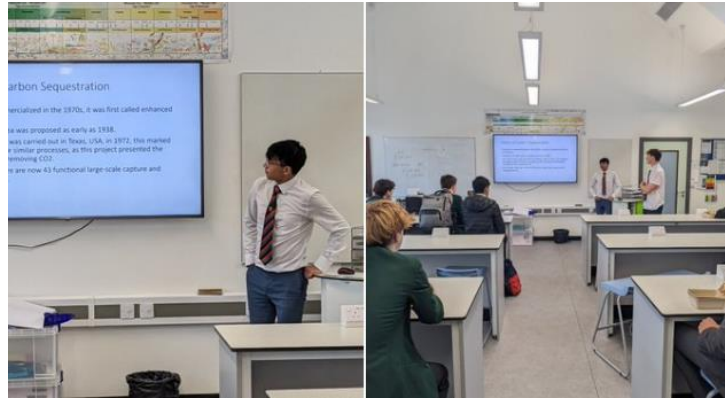

Lessons from Auschwitz Project



This week I was one of a lucky few at my school to be able to attend the Lessons From Auschwitz project. Within a single day they took us on a tour of both KL Auschwitz and Auschwitz-Birkenau.

The holocaust is incomprehensible, words like 'harrowing' and 'evil' barely even scratch the surface. I would urge every one of you to visit and try and

begin to understand the horrors that Nazis inflicted on the European population.

It is important to say that each individual's experience is different. For me, the most touching moment was in KL Auschwitz where they have on display the 'Book of Names.' Produced by Yad Vashem, it has all the names of those who died. They are currently at 4 million names and continue their work to this day. But the most emotional moment for me was seeing my family's name within this book, their birth dates, and where they died.

I am the first one in my family to visit the concentration camps since the war, and that is what made my personal experience so special. It wasn't just a history trip for me, but it symbolised the survival of those that managed to escape, a celebration of how we are now thriving in society. Although not religious myself, it was scary to see that I would have been in the same position as those that had died if I were to be born only 80 years ago.



Thank you again to the team from Lessons From Auschwitz and AGSB for providing me with this invaluable experience.

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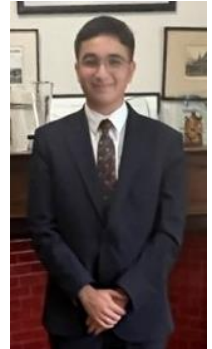
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Well Done

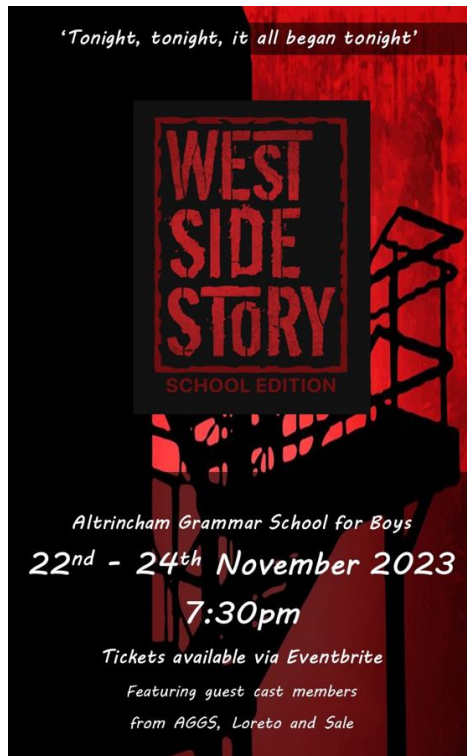




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Important Date for your Diary – West Side Story – 22nd to 24th November
