## Y11 GCSE Geography Fieldwork in Snowdonia



After a period of Covid disruption, normality has returned to Geography with a full programme of fieldwork returning in 2022. On the 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> September, 76 GCSE students and four Geography staff visited Snowdonia for two days. On the first day students left the field study centre at Bets-y-Coed to trek to the beautiful Cwm Idwal, where they were able to apply their learning from Geography to identify glaciated landforms and discover new intriguing features. Staff and leaders from the FSC did a

great job keeping spirits high throughout, and students clearly enjoyed the adventure - most singing their hearts out on the coach home! Students were a real credit.

Day 2 saw students carrying out practical fieldwork to investigate how the characteristics of the Afon Conwy river changes downstream. There was a sense of excitement amongst staff and students to be out on the moors and wading through rivers in wellies once again - everyone benefits and enjoys the practical side of Geography!

Next stop for the Geography department is Salford Quays for our annual Year 9 fieldtrip in November.

Fin S (Y11) was selected for the Sale Sharks Academy Under 16 squad.



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
(Left) Yusuf R and Dan W (12NW) both competed in a North West powerlifting competition, both breaking records and setting new ones in the U18s category.

#### **Transport For Greater Manchester**

Before travelling to and from school it is important to plan-ahead and consider different options.

Transport for Greater Manchester has <u>a dedicated School's Hub</u>, with information about public transport services, tickets and passes, latest dedicated travel advice for our school and tips around cycling and walking.



If you can, please consider whether your child can walk or cycle to school – it can be a safe and healthy way to make shorter trips. With new cycling and walking routes popping up across the region, it is safer and easier than ever to get about on foot or by bike.

If you do need to drive, please switch off your

engine when waiting outside to reduce air pollution and, if possible, try parking further away and walking the last part of the journey. It is also very important that you do not park on double yellow lines or cause obstruction to other road users. Marlborough Road is a very busy road and it is of the utmost



importance that you do not upset the local residents. A Traffic Officer will be patrolling the road from time to time and you will be ticketed and fined if you are found to be causing a nuisance.

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From the 4<sup>th</sup> September, the cost of a child's bus fare in Greater Manchester will be capped at £1 for a single journey and £2.50 for an 1-day AnyBus travelcard.
