Dear Parents, Carers and Students

When we returned to school in September, none of us really knew what the next few months would bring. We all hoped we would return to some form of normal school life, and although pupils and staff have continued to wear face coverings around the site, it has been a relief to get through the term without any further disruption.

There has undoubtedly been a good deal of progress on the academic front and the transition from bubbling to teaching in specialist areas has been especially welcomed by all. This is an outstanding achievement considering they were competing against some of the top independent schools and University bands in the country.

**MUN:** it was wonderful to witness the return of MUN conferences this term and AGSB enjoyed great success at both the Cheadle Hulme School MUNCH and the MGS MUN Conference.

**House system:** The House system continues to flourish and pupils have had several opportunities this term to renew House rivalries, be it on the sports field, in debates, or on stage.

We do not know, at this stage, what the New Year will bring but I hope that we will be returning on the 10<sup>th</sup> January as planned. And so, on behalf of all of us here at AGSB, all that remains is for me to say thank you for your support through what has been a very full and successful term, and to wish you all the merriest of Christmases and the happiest of New Year's. 

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### Round up of the Year in numbers



We are coming to the end of a busy and successful term. Here is the term in "Numbers". Well done to staff and pupils for all their efforts over the past three and a half months. 

### Noticeboard for Parents Vaccinations and LFD testing

- 12-15-year olds who have not been vaccinated can book an appointment out of school on the National Booking System, and from 20<sup>th</sup> December, those eligible for second doses will be also be able to book.
- All eligible students to be aware of the latest information on the booster programme and how to book a booster and parents and students to be aware of the vaccination offer for students
- All students of secondary age and above continue to test twice-weekly

### Daily testing for contacts of COVID-19

From 14<sup>th</sup> December, a new national approach to daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 has been introduced. All adults who are fully vaccinated and children aged 5 to18 years and 6 months, identified as a contact of someone with COVID-19 – whether Omicron or not – should take an LFD test every day for 7 days instead of self-isolating. Children under five years old do not need to take part in daily testing for contacts of COVID-19 and do not need to isolate.

Once notified by Test and Trace as a close contact, all eligible staff, pupils and students are strongly recommended to take a LFD each day for 7 days and report the results through the <u>online reporting</u> <u>system</u> and to their setting. If they test negative, they can continue to attend their education setting. Outside of the education setting, they should continue to follow <u>national guidance</u>. This approach should also be adopted over the Christmas holiday and on return in January.

January 2022 Student Mass Testing

Parents and Carers have received Mr Soulsby's letter detailing full instructions for the return to School on the 10<sup>th</sup> January 2022. To be clear, Years 13, 11, 10, 7 & 9 return on Monday and Year 8 return to school on Tuesday, 11<sup>th</sup> January.

- Students in Years 7 to 11 should take a lateral flow test at home, up to three days before the return to school.
- In addition to this, students will also take a lateral flow test in school on Mon, 10<sup>th</sup> January 2022.

Students will not be able to join lessons until they have completed their lateral flow test. As soon as students have been tested, and a negative result returned, they will be free to go to the lesson on their timetable.

We will be using the same consent gathered as part of our previous lateral flow testing process. This consent list is cross-referenced with our 90-day exemption records. Unfortunately, we may not be able to keep this database 100% live over the Christmas break ready for the 10<sup>th</sup> January and so if you son tests positive whilst school is closed, please report the positive case to <u>covid@agsb.co.uk</u> and also send him into school with evidence of a positive PCR test. If your son presents evidence of a positive PCR test, he will not be tested.

Pupils should only arrive for their allotted testing day and time and not before. Please also note that any students being tested after lunch will not have access to the dining facilities and therefore must either bring a packed lunch or eat before they arrive at school.

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
