Many thanks to the 6th Form team who have prepared and sent 226 university applications (in time for Thursday's UCAS deadline).

The Concert Band, Big Band and String Orchestra performed a number of contemporary hits with a host of amazing vocalists (including students from AGGS, Loreto GS and Sale GS). Our indoor Hockey team travelled to London to represent the North West at the National Finals. 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Geography Fieldwork in Ancoats



On Friday 13 January and again on Tuesday 17th, GCSE geographers embarked to Ancoats, aiming to investigate how sustainable its regeneration had been. After taking the tram to New Islington, we walked alongside the canal, taking it in. It was interesting to see a blend of historic, preserved buildings and more modern, exciting ones. Once we arrived at George Leigh Street, we undertook an Environmental Quality Survey to see whether Ancoats was environmentally sustainable. We tracked the environment's quality as we went further from the CBD, finding it decreased. However, the friendliness was off the charts, with people approaching to crack a few jokes and talk about their experiences living there. I was shocked to learn one resident preferred science to geography, when geography is clearly the best!

We then broke off into groups for lunch and were allowed to explore the Northern Quarter- a vibrant area that had been transformed by gentrification. We were enticed by

the independent shops and bohemian cafes, though McDonalds was clearly the popular choice! Following this, we did a land use survey. Despite the initial moans and groans, we all enjoyed it so much. We got to enter all sorts of buildings and talk to people to see how the area was being used. We finished the fieldtrip by doing a sustainability audit, with everyone contribution their views and engaging in the spirited discussion, before returning back. Annual Holocaust Memorial Trip



Around the 27th January every year, students from across Trafford gather to commemorate the millions of lives lost in the tragic events of the Holocaust. People pay their respects to the lost family members of individuals and to the heroes who put their lives on the line to save innocent victims. The 27th is an extremely important date as it marks the liberation of the concentration

camp Auschwitz by the Soviets and is the reason the memorial is held on this date.



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AGSB takes two students from each History class to represent the School's support and regard for the people who were affected by the horrific incidents of the Holocaust. The memorial this week took place at the Robert Bolt Theatre at the Sale Waterside Centre where students from a large variety of schools, both primary and secondary, perform dramas, poems, and songs and share their accounts about their experiences. This was accompanied by speeches from prestigious members of the Jewish community alongside those closely affected by the events. The memorial concluded with the Jewish Memorial Prayer and the lighting of Three Candles of Remembrance, symbolising both the victims of the Holocaust, Jewish and otherwise, and the victims of all other tragic genocides.



The trip was eye-opening for the students, and it allowed them to empathise with the victims of the Holocaust and build a deeper understanding of the saddening events. I am sure that all of us thoroughly enjoyed the trip and have thus been able to broaden our understanding of the Holocaust.

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University Update January 2023



The Sixth Form team have now sent off the final application to UCAS for this academic year. In total 196 applications were sent off for the current Year 13 students and 28 for students who left last year.

Our current Year 13 students have applied to 953 degree

courses across 79 different Universities. So far, our students have received 402 offers and will be waiting for final offers over the next few months.

The Sixth Form team all pull together with various roles and areas of expertise to provide a high degree of support to our students. An extensive process ensures that every student's application is thoroughly checked to ensure that it is as strong as possible. We are delighted to welcome Jane Hutchinson to the team this year. She brings both experience and capacity to support our students effectively. I am sure students will benefit from this over the years to come.

We were delighted with the number of successful offers from Oxford and Cambridge Universities. In total 19 offers were received from a broad range of courses from Arts and Humanities; such as PPE, History, Music and Fine Art to STEM related subjects; such as Earth Sciences, Medicine, Physics and Maths.

The Sixth Form team is also supporting students who are applying for degree level apprenticeships, with students already preparing for interviews from employers such as PWC and Airbus.

We will be inviting parents and students of Year 12 students from AGSB and other local schools. 
English Schools National Cup
