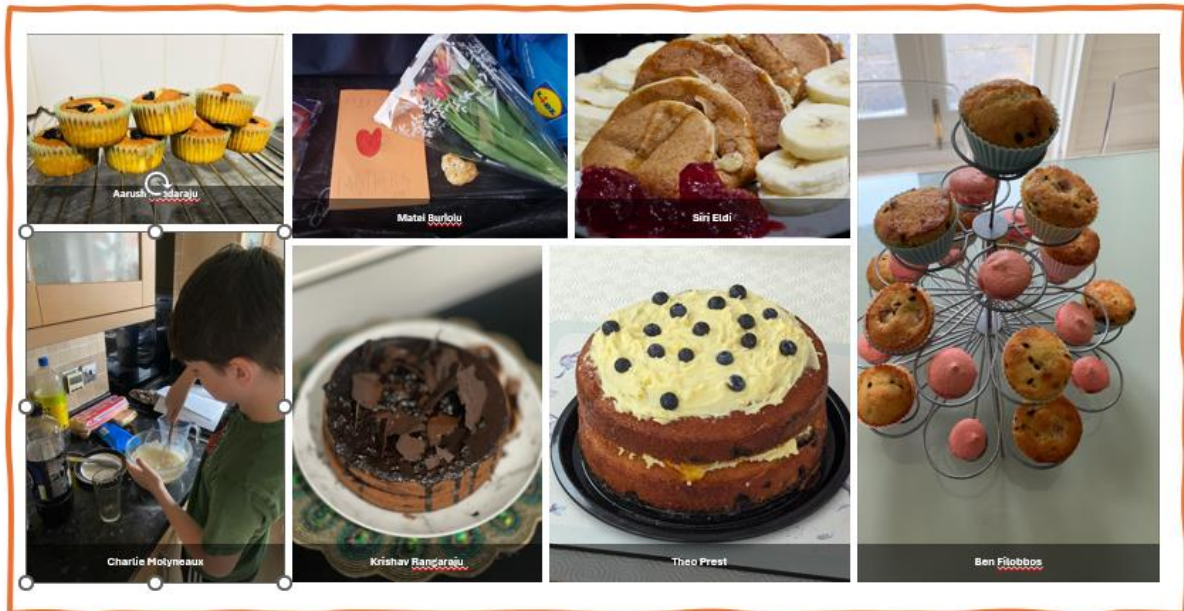

ARTiculation Prize



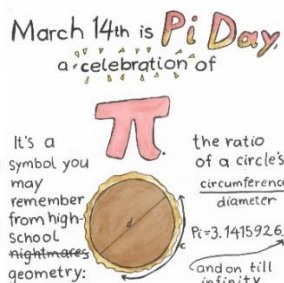

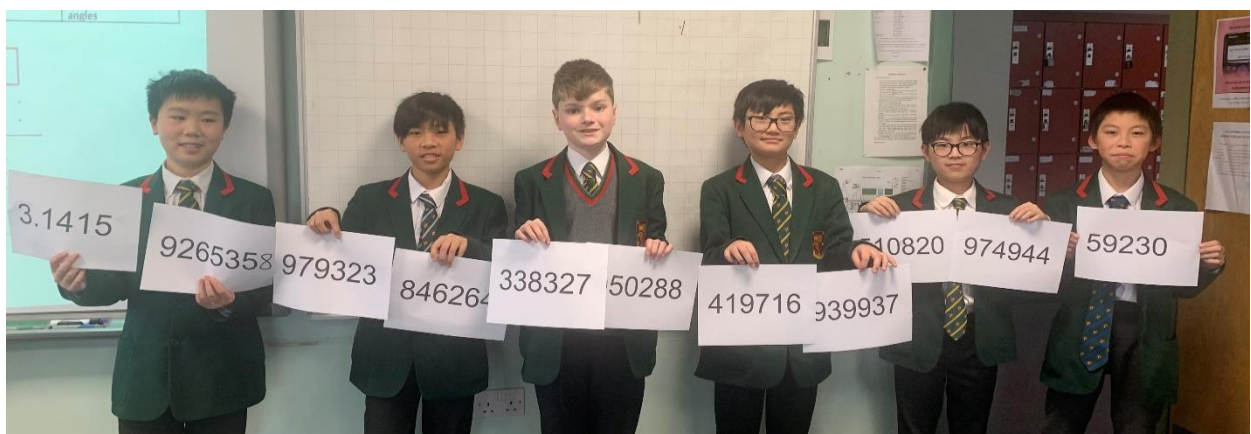
Pi Day Competition

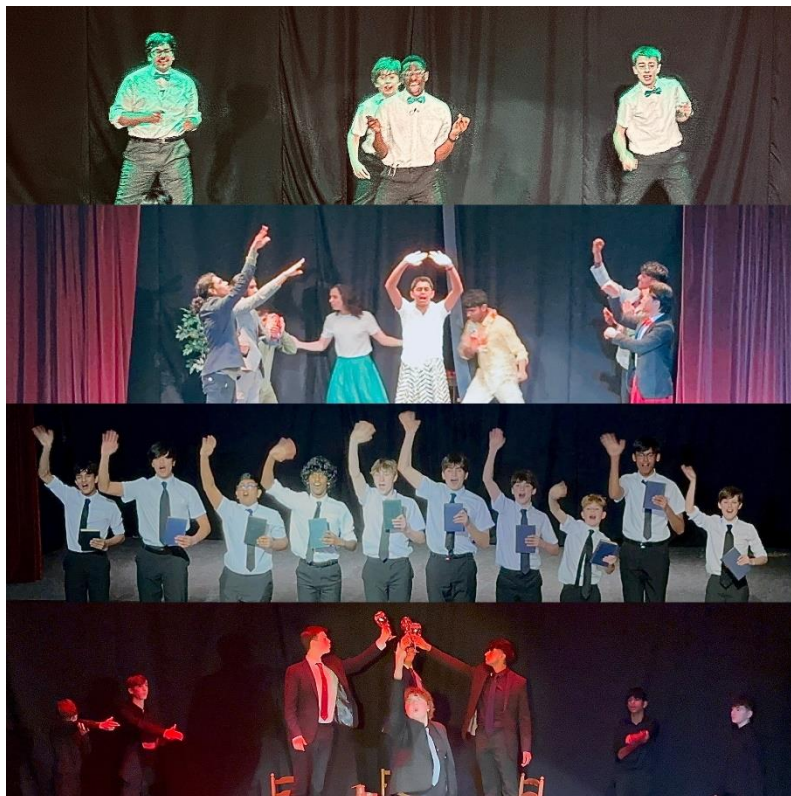
We had to endure many injuries, close games and extreme pressure however each team did their very best and we finished with a National Champions title in Kho-Kho, as well as runners up in football.

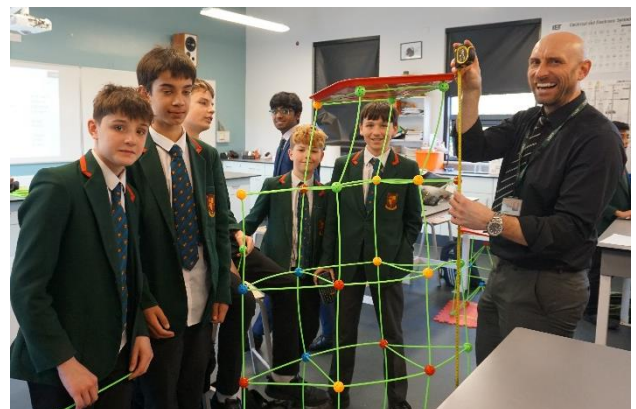

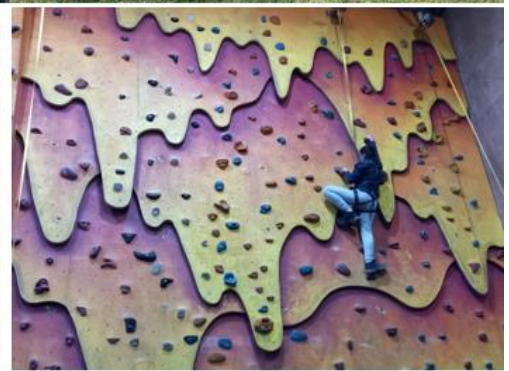

Geology Trip to Cyprus



Last week the Year 13 Geologists made their annual pilgrimage to Cyprus to complete their Geology fieldwork in style. Staying in beautiful hills outside of Paphos, the 29 students and 4 members of staff travelled all over the island inspecting the rare and varied geology that Cyprus has to offer, travelling over 1,000 km.



Students were able to study recent sedimentary deposits, ancient pieces of the Tethys ocean, now thrust up into mountain ranges, 300 million year old coral reefs as well as calculating the value of some of Cyprus's vast mineral reserves.

The trip serves as a vital part of the Geology A Level course, allowing pupils to complete their practical endorsement requirements as well as serving as an

excellent revision experience prior to their upcoming summer examinations.

Plans are already underway to return to the island next year with our current year 12 students.
