After a period of intense activity in school, we have reached the end of a highly successful academic year. Activities Week has taken centre stage for the past few days and I would like to thank Mr Gooch for organising an action-packed itinerary with numerous activities on offer including trips to Paris, Barcelona and London.

Our Music programme ended for the year with an excellent Year 7 and Year 8 Showcase Concert on Tuesday. It was marvellous to see so many parents and carers witnessing the musical talent of their son's. The annual House Sports day was another highlight, and it was great to see so many students supporting their Houses in another keenly contested athletic competition. The Sports Department dealt brilliantly with the complex organisation of the event (and the weather!), which was a great success.

Over the last two weeks pupils have also enjoyed academic success in Biology Olympiads, Maths Challenges and the Cambridge University Chemistry Challenge where our Year 12 Chemists secured 8 golds (top 10%), 5 silver and 3 copper awards. ### Maths Modelling Day



On Monday, Paco L, Joe C, Alex V, Isaac AW and Amil C travelled over to the University of Manchester to attend the North West Mathematical Modelling event. Our team of five Y12 Further Mathematicians were given the choice of attending two sessions based around the applications of seemingly abstract mathematical concepts to the real world. From secure cryptography methods using the modulus function to building mathematically stable bridge structures, these sessions covered a wide range of maths. Perhaps the most intriguing moment was the topic of the combinatorics of shuffling cards, where the number of possible orders of 52 cards was found to be 52! (52 factorial; also known as 52  $x 51 \times 50 \times ... \times 2 \times 1$ ), or numerically equal to

about  $(8.07 \times 10^{67})$ . For those who are unfamiliar with this notation, it is approximately equal to the digit 8 followed by 67 zeros – a large number indeed. But how large? We don't really have any reliable frame of reference to truly understand, but the following analogy might help:

"Imagine that you are an immortal being standing on the equator of the Earth. You have a timer on which you enter  $(8.07 \times 10^{67})$  seconds. Start the count down and wait 1 Billion years. After those years, take one single step forward (assume you have the ability to walk on water) and wait another Billion years. Repeat these steps until you have walked all the way around the equator and ended up at your starting position. At this point, take one small droplet of water out of the ocean, and restart your tiresome circumnavigation along the equator. Every lap of the Earth you will take out a singular droplet until all of Earth's Oceans are drained — at which point you may place one thin sheet of A4 paper on the ground beside you (and the oceans are magically refilled, of course). You must continue draining the Earth's oceans many times and stacking the paper until your magical paper tower reaches the surface of the sun. At this point, you wipe the sweat from your brow and check the timer. You look on in horror, as you see it reads that about (8.066  $\times 10^{67}$ ) seconds remain — you have barely made a dint in the time needed to wait 52! seconds. Not to worry though, simply burn the paper stack and repeat the entire thing around 2000 times and you'll get there eventually..."

And that it just a description of how many ways there are to shuffle a deck of cards (not even with the Jokers). Specific numbers and calculations have been left out, so if you are determined enough, it would be an interesting challenge to work out the exact time taken by each stage. Clearly, there are many more fascinating areas of maths to be explored – as well as their relevance to the real world.
